



Sima Gazikalović was born on November 20, 1947. He became a graduated cameraman at the Faculty of Arts in Zurich, Department of Special Effects Camera, which he attended from 1973 to 1977. His professional career as a cameraman began on the Radio and Television of Serbia in 1980.

He worked in the public service for 20 years, until 2000. That year, from October to December, he was the Director of Channel 3. In December 2000, he was engaged in resolving the crisis in the municipalities of Presevo, Bujanovac and Medvedja. At that time, he was responsible for working with ethnic communities and performing the duties related to cooperation with the media. In 2001, he was elected the first President of the Coalition for Returning to Kosovo and Metohija and became an active contributor to the resolution of the crisis in Kosovo and Metohija. At the same time, he was in charge of the issues territorially related to the resolution of problems in the Morava River's region in Kosovo and Metohija.

At the time of the crisis in the municipalities of Presevo, Bujanovac and Medvedja, he was an active participant in all discussions with representatives of the international community on the issue of addressing the crisis in the three municipalities. From 2000 to 2008, he was continually engaged in working at the Bujanovac-based Coordination Body's Office.

He is married and has three children.
