

MILAN MARKOVIĆ

Mr. Milan Marković is Minister of Public Administration and Local Self-Government in the Government of the Republic of Serbia.

He was born in Belgrade on September 7, 1970.

He is a graduate lawyer by profession and he has passed a bar exam. He has also specialized in the field of fight against terrorism at the Faculty of Security in Belgrade.



He was Head of Belgrade's Palilula district from 2000 to 2004, the people's representative in the Serbian parliament as of 2001, Chairman of the Managing Board of the PKB (Agricultural Corporation "Belgrade" a.d) from 2001 until 2006, Deputy Chairman of the Managing Board of "Prva petoletka" from 2002 until 2003, the city's representative in the parliament from 2000 until 2004 and Deputy President of the National Assembly of the Republic of Serbia from 2003 to 2007.

He was appointed Minister of Public Administration and Local Self-Government in the government of the Republic of Serbia at the National Assembly's session of May 15, 2007. The National Assembly, at its session held on July 7, 2008, re-elected Mr. Milan Marković to the same position in Mirko Čvetković's Government.

The Government of the Republic of Serbia, at its session held on August 28, 2008, appointed Mr. Milan Marković, Minister of Public Administration and Local Self-Government, President of the Coordination Body for the Municipalities of Preševo, Bujanovac and Medvedja.

He's a lecturer on request at the Faculty of Security's specialized studies and an associate for research projects.
